County Administrator Shackett had nothing new to report.

Nursing Home Administrator Richardson stated there are no pending tests. The nursing home has received 450 cloth masks for residents. The nursing home has hired 2 fulltime LNA's and one per diem RN.

Restorative Justice Director MacFadzen stated his department is status quo and they are continuing to contact clients by phone.

Sheriff Moyer stated the department is getting business done just not as usual. He stated he is working to get the Chiefs meeting moved up.

Superintendent Gray stated he received a call from Director of Homeland Security looking for total number of employees. He believes they are looking into a stipend for workers. There are no pending tests for staff or inmates.

Accounting Manager Sharp stated there is nothing new to report. There was a discussion about the upcoming tax anticipation note request. County Administrator Shackett has been emailing back and forth with Rep Sylvia regarding upcoming Delegation meeting and how it might look with social distancing.

Register of Deeds McGrath stated it is business as usual.

County Attorney Livernois stated everything is good in the department. They are concerned about what is going to happen when the courts do open.

Commissioner DeVoy stated that Rep Lang was appointed to committee that will be providing a recommendation to the Governor about opening the State. County Attorney Livernois stated the meetings have started and are open to the public to listen. The information can be found on the State website.
