WHAT'S DRIVING THE INCREASE IN TAXES?

- The loss of fund balance applied to the tax rate is the biggest driver of the increase.
- There are also increases in expenses, which is to be expected given the increase in the cost of living.
- There are four new employees being requested.
- Most capital projects have been removed from the operational budget and are expected to be funded through ARPA funds.
- The net nursing home cost has been held to \$1.3M, a small piece of the total tax requirement.
